DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,728**, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body represents the "American Eagle" looking to the right and standing on a rock. His wings are outstretched, and in his beak he holds a ribbon encircling his head and body, with the motto "E Pluribus Unum." Thirteen stars are arched above the figure, the whole standing in a circle. Each of the four corners is

filled with a design of the American shield surrounded by fancy ornaments.

The design may be executed on a larger scale within an increased number of squares.

I reserve the right to reverse the position of the figure in the circle, and to increase or diminish the number of figures in the border; also, to paint the body and the border in different colors for embroidery-work.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-patterns, consisting of a representation of an eagle holding in his beak a ribbon with the motto "E Pluribus Unum" and a border of shield corners, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
