## DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,729, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body represents a boy turned to the right, with one limb resting on the ground. In one hand he holds a dish, and in the other a pipe, from which he is about to release a bubble. A number of bubbles float about him. The border consists of alternating figures—bubble and goblet shaped. Extending inwardly from the corners of the border are four bubble-

shaped ornaments incased in a square frame. A row of small dots lines the border on the inside.

The design may be executed on a larger scale within an increased number of squares.

I reserve the right to reverse the figures in the body and to increase or diminish the number of bubbleand goblet figures in the border; also, to paint the figure in the body and the border in different colors for embroiderywork.

I claim-

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of a representation of a boy blowing soap-bubbles, surrounded by a border of bubble and goblet shaped figures, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
