DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body represents a crowing rooster looking to the right, who is inclosed in a circle, which stands in a square with blunt corners. The border represents fanciful flowers spreading their leaves toward the center of the border, where they

almost meet small detached figures of different sizes.

The design may be executed on a larger scale within an increased number of squares.

I reserve the right to reverse the position of the rooster, and to increase or diminish the figures in the border; also, to paint the body and the border in different colors for embroidery-work.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of a representation of a crowing rooster, surrounded by a border of fanciful flowers and spreading leaves, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
