DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body consists of the representation of a parrot perched on an ornamental vine, picking at a bunch of grapes. The border consists of small figures, hook-shaped, meeting in the corners in a small plain ornament.

The design may be executed on a larger scale, and within an increased number of squares. I reserve the right to increase or diminish the number of hooks in the border, and to reverse the position of the body figures; also, to paint the body and the border in different colors for embroidery-work.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of a representation of a parrot perched on an ornamental vine, with hook-shaped border, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
