DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crotchet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is worked in squares, and consists of a body and a border. The body represents a buck and a roe standing on the ground facing one another. The branches of two trees extend above the heads of each in the upper corners. The border contains a chain on each side of the square, fastened to two-armed ornaments in each corner.

The design may be worked on a larger scale within an increased number of squares.

I reserve the right to reverse the positions of the buck and the roe, and to add to or take away from the chains and ornaments in the border; also, to paint the figures in the body and the border in different colors for embroidery-work.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-patterns, consisting of a representation of a buck and a roe surrounded by foliage, and a border of chain-pattern, with ornamental corners, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
