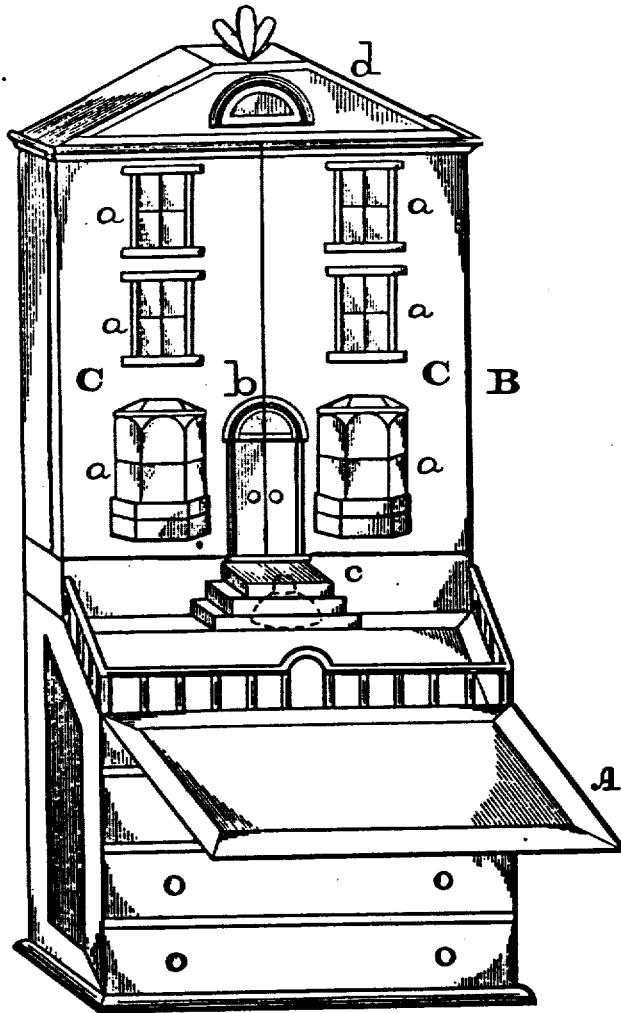

DESIGN FOR BOOK OR SECRETARY CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,741**, dated October 19, 1875; application filed October 2, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HUGH S. KERR, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Design for Book or Secretary Case, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the writing lid or shelf attached to the desk-frame; and B the book or secretary case, whose doors C have windows *a a*, which admit light into the case, and the

outlines of a front door, as at *b*, at the bottom of which are steps *c*. The top of the case B is in the form of a roof, *d*, which, with the other features stated, imparts to the case the appearance of a house. If desired, a railing may be placed at what represents the ground of the house or base of the case B.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for the case B, having doors C, provided with windows *a a* and front door *b*, steps *c*, and the roof *d*, presenting the appearance of a house, as shown and set forth.
