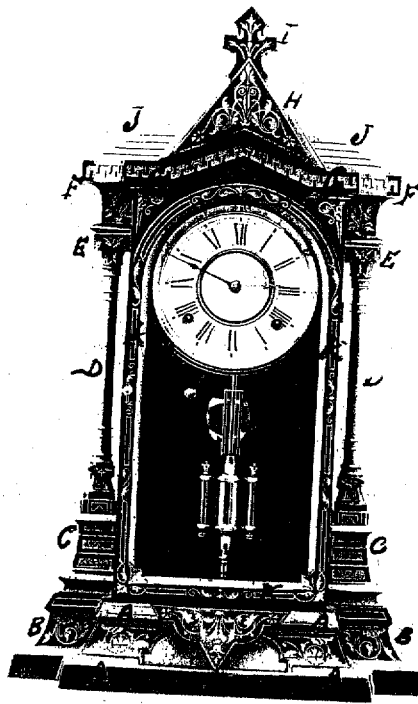

DESIGN FOR A CLOCK-CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,742**, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 25, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HERMANN J. MULLER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Clock-Case, of which the following is a specification:

The figure is a front view of a clock-case illustrating my design.

A is the base or lower part of the case, the foot of which projects a little. The front of the base A is slightly concaved, and its end parts are ornamented with vines and leaves. The middle part of the front of the base has a semicircular recess formed in it, with an offset at each end of its arch, and over the center of which is a pointed projection, the point of which touches the projecting foot, and its front is ornamented with vines and leaves. At the ends of the base A are projections B, similar in form and ornamentation to the front of said base A, and upon the tops of which rest the pedestals C of two shafts, D. Upon the capitals E of the shafts D rest the end parts or projections F of the top G of the case. The fronts of the projections F and top G are ornamented with vines and leaves, to correspond with the form and ornamentation of

the projections B and base A. The front of the edge of the tops of the projections F and top G are ornamented with a zigzag work. Above the front edge of the top G is a triangular projection, H, the apex of which is surmounted with an ornamental cross, I. The front of the projection H and cross I are ornamented with vines and leaves. Upon the top of the end projections F of the top G are formed inclined or roof-shaped projections J which extend into the rear of the projection H. The door-frame K is made with an arched top and rectangular bottom, and is ornamented with vines and leaves.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a clock-case formed of the base A and its end projections B, the pedestals C, the shafts D, the capitals E, the top G and its end projections F, the triangular projection H and its surmounting cross I, the top projections J, and the door-frame K, the whole being shaped and ornamented as herein shown and described.
