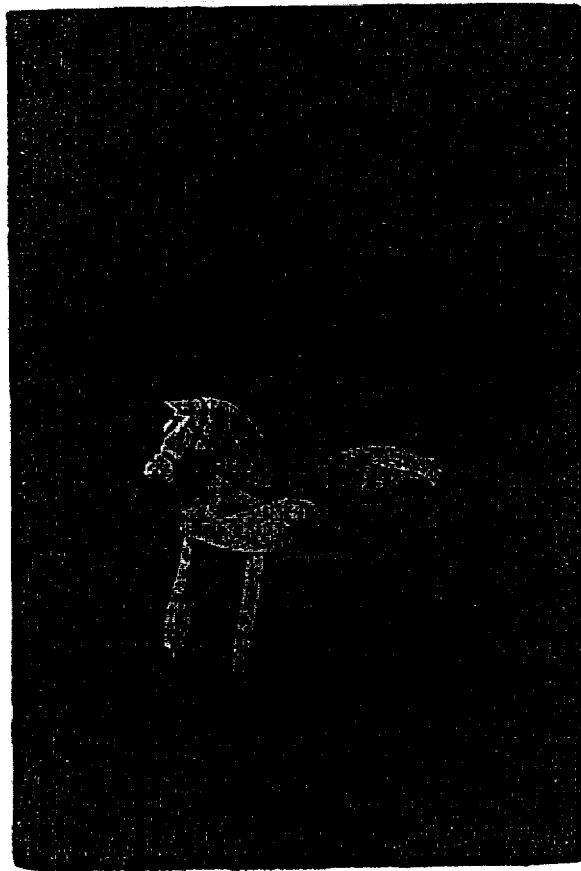

DESIGN FOR A HOBBY-HORSE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,743**, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 16, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH SHOENINGER, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated and designed a Pattern for a Child's Walking Horse, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

What I claim as my invention is—
