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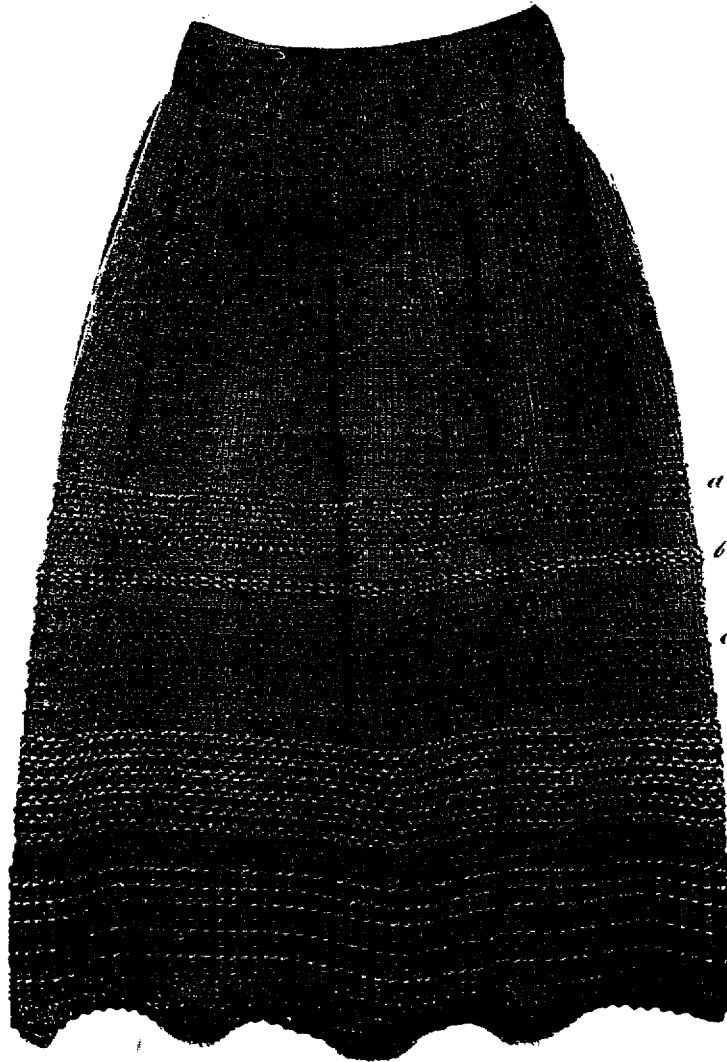

DESIGN FOR KNITTED SKIRTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S,745**, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 4, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL WALLIS, of Newton, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and original Design for Knitted Skirts, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The said design consists of fancy borders wrought upon the bottoms of ladies' and misses' double-ribbed skirts by stitches of different kinds, making bands which contrast conspicuously with the groundwork of the body and with each other. The stitches may be of any approved kind, the only essential requirement being that the adjacent bands or rows differ conspicuously from each other, and

in connection with these bands of ornamental stitches I also propose to use different-colored yarns as an additional ornamentation.

In the accompanying photographic illustration of a skirt ornamented according to my design, *a, b, c, d,* and *e* represent five different bands of stitches, contrasting with each other, and making a very neat border.

I claim as my invention—

The herein-described design for the ornamentation of knitted skirts, consisting of bands of ornamental stitches conspicuously contrasting with the groundwork and with each other, with or without yarns of different colors.
