DESIGN FOR TOY MONEY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.746, dated October 19, 1875; application filed September 30, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, John Murray and John A. C. J. Smith, of the city and county of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, have originated and Designed a Money-Bank, under the title of "Independence Hall Money-Bank," of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration making part of this specification.

The nature of our design is fully illustrated in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

A represents the main or central building, which contains Independence Hall. B is the left wing, and C the right wing. The central building A has a tower, F, which supports the cupola H, in which is hung the bell I. The

left wing has a cupola, H¹, and the right wing a cupola, H². The central building A has an opening, J, in its roof K, the left wing B an opening, J¹, in its roof K¹, and the right wing C an opening, J², in its roof K² for the passage of deposits.

We claim-

The design for a toy money-bank formed to represent the old Independence-Hall building at Philadelphia, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
