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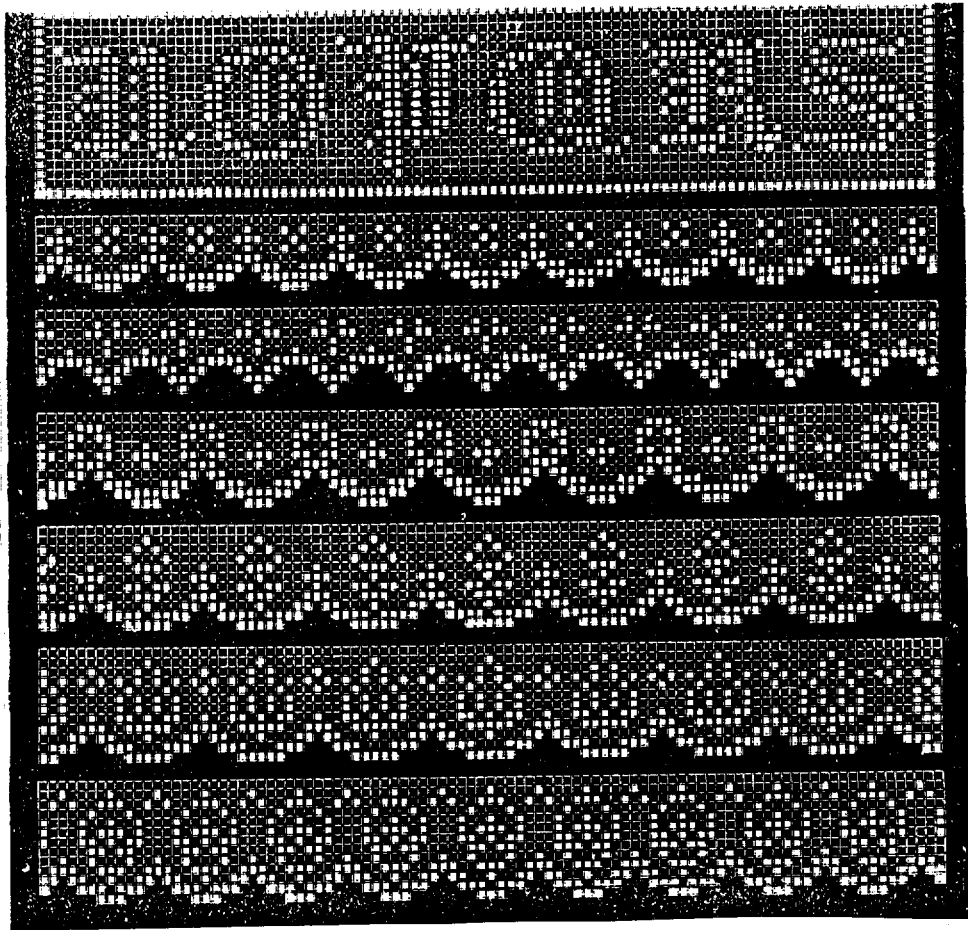

DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,751**, dated October 26, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is for embroidery-pattern, and consists of a representation of German-text letters from N to S, inclusive, and laces A B C D E F. A contains nine arches, B twelve,

C seven, D and E seven, and F nine; all but B curve outwardly, the latter curving inwardly. The bodies of A B C D E F are filled with small ornaments, as illustrated by accompanying print.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of representation of German-text letters from N to S, inclusive, and the plain narrow laces A B C D E F, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
