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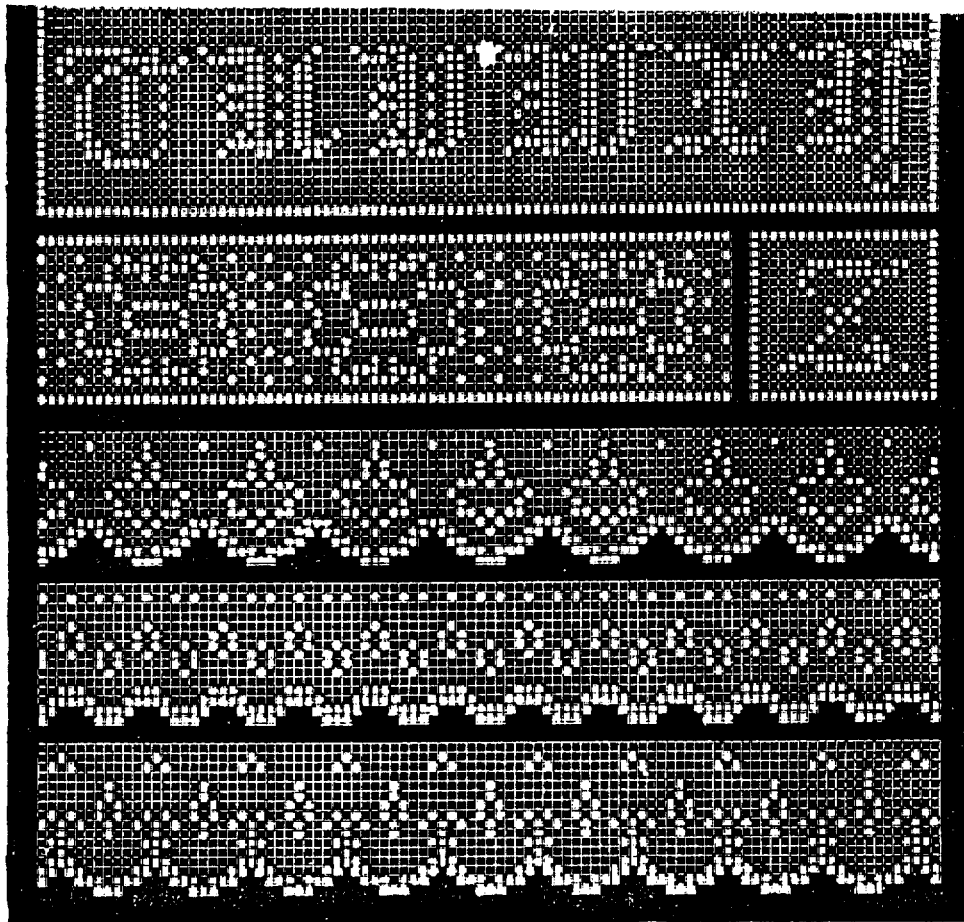

DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,752**, dated October 26, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York; in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is for embroidery-pattern, and consists of a representation of German-text letters T to Z, inclusive, the insertion A, and laces B C D. Insertion A contains figures with horizontal oval designs in the center, surrounded by an irregular figure, the spaces

between each figure being filled in with dots. B contains seven arches, C eleven, and D nine. The borders of B C D are filled in with small ornaments, as illustrated by accompanying print. A B C D can be worked any length desired.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-work, consisting of a representation of German-text letters from T to Z, inclusive, the insertion A, with horizontal ovals, and the plain narrow laces B C D, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
