

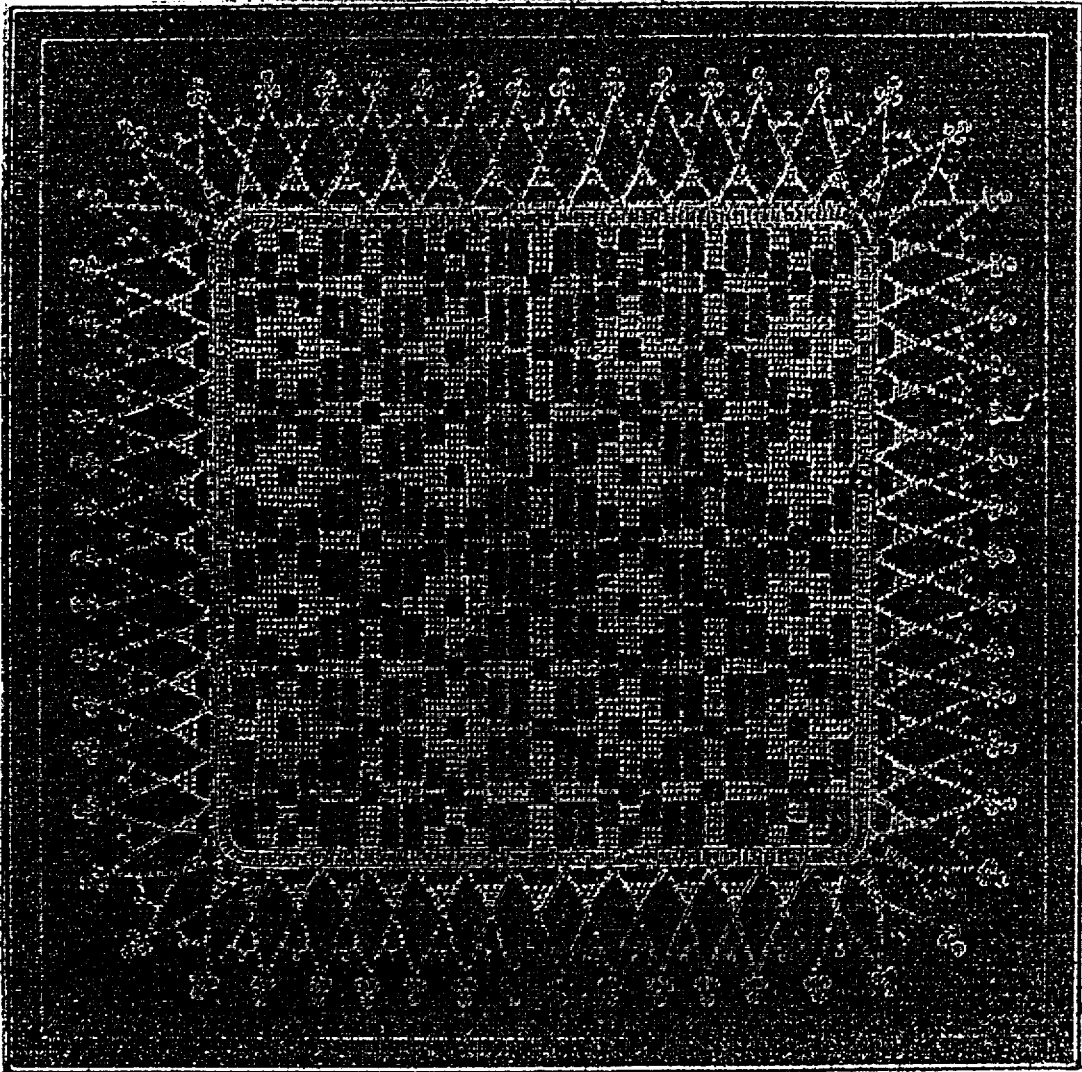

DESIGN FOR CROCHET-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,753**, dated October 26, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is for crochet-pattern, consisting of a representation of square frame, B B B B, with rounded corners, horizontal bars C C C, and perpendicular bars D D D D D. The squares formed by the crossing bars are filled with top-shaped figures; horizontal lines intersect the figures. The border consists of narrow bars crossing one another in the shape of

the letter X, which are fastened together near their bases and near their tops, and are finished with heads in the shape of three-leaved clover.

I reserve the right to take away from or add to the number of figures in the body, or the cross-bars of the border.

I claim—

The design for crochet-pattern, consisting of the representation of a square tidy with rounded corners, containing top-shaped figures, bounded by horizontal and perpendicular bars, the whole finished with a border of crossed bars, as illustrated in accompanying drawing.
