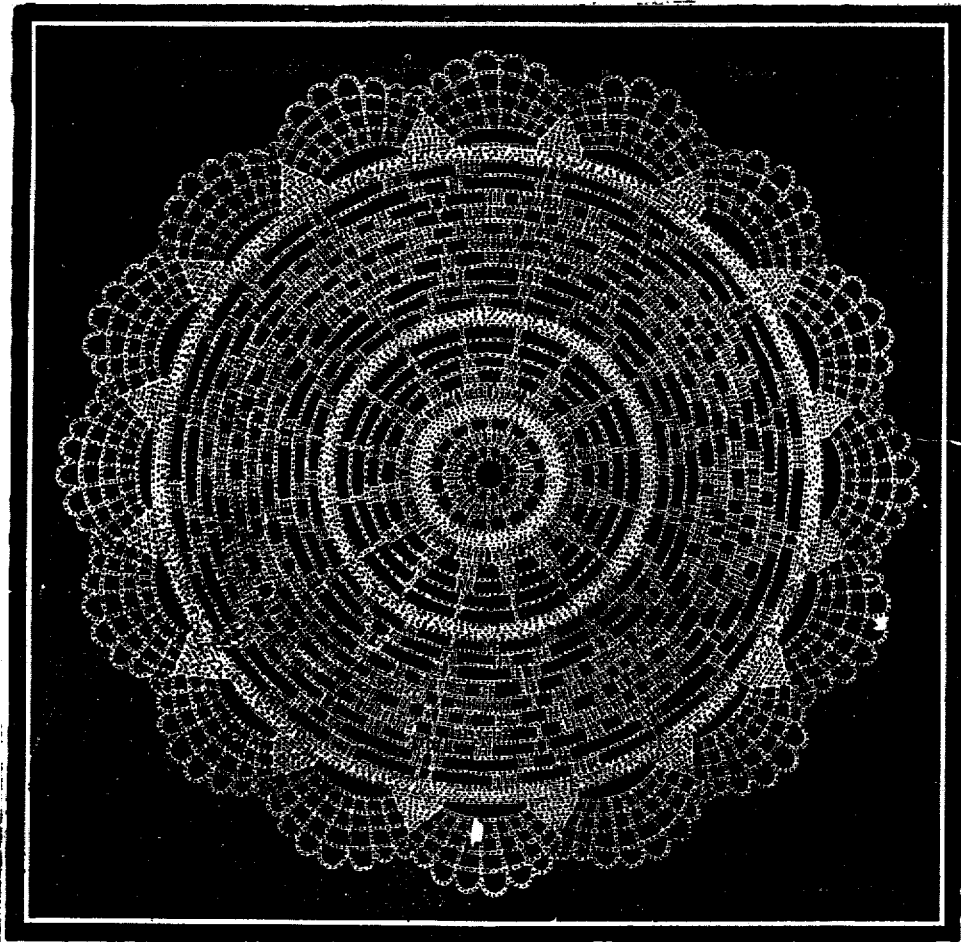

## DESIGN FOR CROCHET-PATTERNS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,754**, dated October 26, 1875; application filed September 20, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

### No. 1.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern-Chart for Crochet or Embroidery Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying printed illustration, to which reference is made.

The design is for crochet-pattern, consisting of a representation round in shape, containing a center-piece, an outer body, and a lace border. The center-piece is in the shape of a star containing sixteen rays, which break through four circles, and end in the line dividing it from outer body. The outer body consists of eight top-shaped figures and eight pairs of pyramids, resting on the center-piece

and the dividing-circle between outer body and lace. These figures alternate, and break through nine circles in the outer body. Resting on the dividing-line and the lace border, on the outside, are sixteen pyramids, pointing outward, which serve to connect the lace border.

I reserve the right to add to or take from the number of circles, rays, top-shaped figures, pyramids, and lace border.

I claim—

The design for crochet-pattern, consisting of representation of a star in the center, surrounded by top-shaped figures and pyramids, breaking through parallel circles, and a lace border, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
