

DESIGN FOR THE CASING OF A SODA-WATER APPARATUS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,778, dated November 9, 1875; application filed October 27, 1875.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK II. SHEPHERD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Casing of a Soda-Water Apparatus, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, making part of this specification.

This invention consists in an ornamental design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus to be placed against a wall, the operator standing in front of the apparatus.

In the photograph, A represents the body or main portion of the easing of a soda-water apparatus, which is of rectangular form, and is provided with an ornamental front, b, projecting out at $e \circ d$ beyond the sides e of the

casing. From the rear of the flat top f of the casing Λ projects an ornamental back, B, in which is set a mirror, C, a beautiful and unique design being thus produced.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is-

1. The design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus, consisting of the rectangular portion Λ , with its ornamental back B, substantially as herein shown and described.

2. The design of the front b, substantially

as shown and described.
