

DESIGN FOR THE CASING OF A SODA-WATER APPARATUS.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK H. SHEPHERD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Casing of a Soda-Water Apparatus, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograph making part of this specification.

In the photograph, A represents the casing of a soda-water apparatus, which is of rectangular form, with a flat top or cover, a. The front and rear plates b c are each provided at the center of their length with ornamental projections, d e, which extend out beyond the planes of the sides f, while the latter are pro-

vided with ornamental projections g h at the top and bottom, which extend ont beyond the planes of the front and rear plates b c, the design thus produced being unique and ornamental.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus, substantially as herein shown and described.
