

DESIGN FOR CROCHET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,781, dated November 9, 1875; application filed October 20, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM STEINHAUS, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and Designed a Pattern-Chart for Crotchet-Work, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying print, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which

reference is being made.

The design is for crochet-pattern, consisting of a representation of a tidy or mat. In the body of the design, in the center, is a solid ring, branching out from which are eight solid rays, widening as they leave the center, and ending in eight solid rings, similar to the ring in the center, which are connected with one another by net-work, which presents the appearance of a star with eight points. Outside of the net-work are eight wheel-shaped figures, each covering a five-pointed star, whose points touch a circle, which is again connected

with a heavier circle by ten bars. The heavy circle is connected with an outer circle by fifty small bars, which is finished off with small loops. Each wheel-shaped figure is connected with the net-work and with the others by a three-armed ornament. The whole design is finished with double loops of lace attached to the wheel-shaped figures.

I reserve the right to work the design on a larger scale, to add to, or take away from, the number of rays, rings, diamonds, lines in the net-work, wheel-shaped figures, rays, circles,

loops, and border.

I claim—

The design for crochet-pattern, composed of a central ring, branching into rays, rings, and diamonds, within net-work, connected with wheel-shaped designs with stars, and a bordering of loops, as above described, and illustrated by accompanying print.
