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

## DESIGN FOR METAL FRAME IN PIANOS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,782, dated November 9, 1875; application filed October 29, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTIAN FR. THEO-DOR STEINWAY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for Piano-Forte, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying drawing shows a face

view of my design.

My invention consists in ornamenting the face of the hitch-pin plate of a piano-forte with rosettes, which are placed in the plane of a line parallel with the outer edge of such plate; also, in ornamenting the edge of the metal frame of a piano-forte with a beaded line, which is interspersed with ornamental studs.

In the accompanying illustration, the letter A designates the hitch-pin plate of a pianoforte, the face of which bears a series of ornamental rosettes, B. These rosettes B have a plain face and a serrated edge, while they are arranged in the plane of a line which is parallel with the exterior edge of the hitch-pin plate. The hitch-pin plate forms an integral part of the metal frame, which is ornamented

with a beaded line, E, which runs along the outer edge of said frame, as shown. This line E is interspersed with ornamented studs F.

By these characteristic features 1 obtain a metal frame for piano-fortes presenting a very

handsome and distinguishing appearance.
What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

1. The design for the hitch-pin plate A of a piano-forte, consisting of the rosettes B, as shown and described.

2. The design for the metal string-frame of a piano-forte, consisting of the beaded line E,

as shown and described.

3. The design for the metal string-frame of a piano-forte, consisting of the rosettes B and the beaded line E, as shown and described.
