

DESIGN FOR A SHOW-CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,787, dated November 9, 1875; application filed October 29, 1875.

• [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. GROVE, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Show-Case, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a show case is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, which shows a skeleton view of the frame without the glass.

The design consists in making the four corners a a of the frame extend outward from the top with a slight curve to about the points x, whence they are curved sharply inward to the bottom of the case.

I claim—

The design for a show-case, the four corners of which project outward from the top of the frame with a slight curve, and are sharply curved inward at the bottom.
