

DESIGN FOR BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,794, dated November 16, 1875; application filed July 9, 1875. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN R. FARRELL, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Design for a Button, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the drawing accompanying and forming part of this specification.

The button is in form like that generally used for military uniforms—that is, provided with a plain border, and having a convexed center crossed by fine parallel lines; but upon the convex portion is placed a monogram formed of the three letters "BSR." This monogram is of the Gothic style, and is formed by placing the two letters "BS," of equal size, side by side, and superimposing on them the letter "R," which is slightly larger than the other two letters, and is involved in the loops of the

other letters. The letters are raised slightly above the surface of the button, and the letters "B" and "S" are burnished, while the letter "R" is crossed by fine diagonal lines.

I do not claim a button having a monogram upon it, nor do I claim a button having a monogram upon it composed of the letters "B S R: " but

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is—
A design for a button having a plain border and convexed center crossed by fine lines, and having upon its center, in relief, a monogram formed, as shown and described, of the letters "B S R."
