

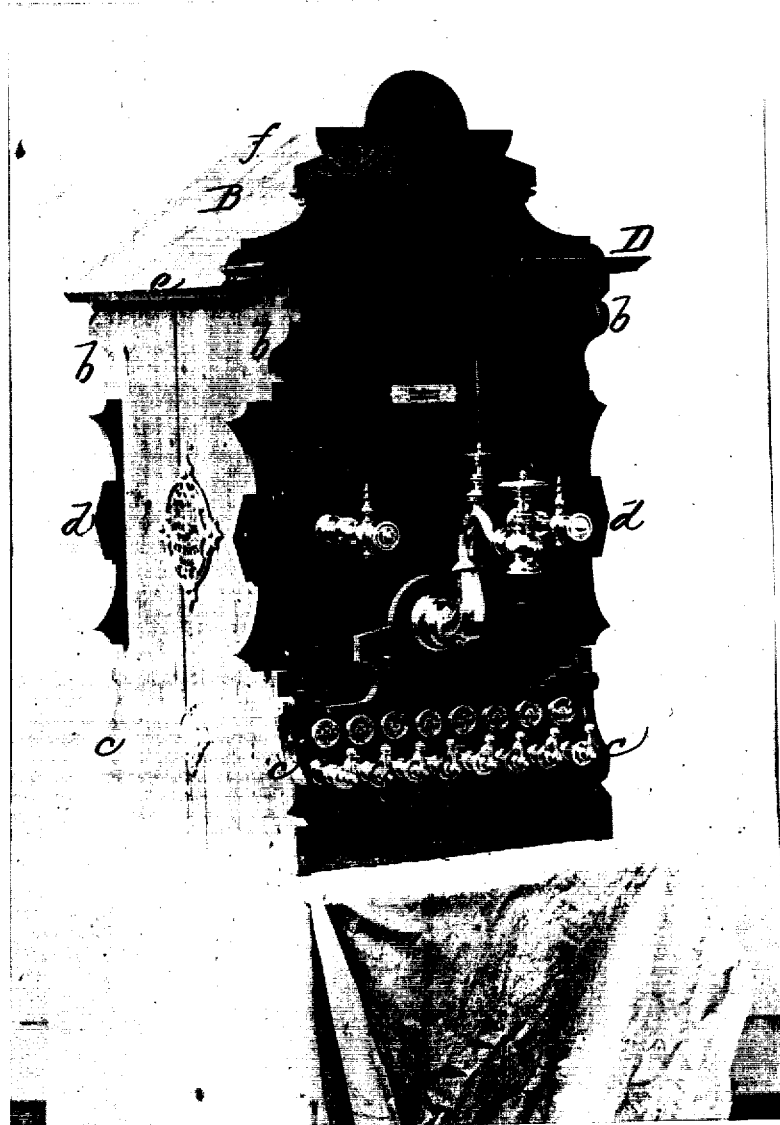

DESIGN FOR THE CASING OF A SODA-WATER APPARATUS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,796**, dated November 16, 1875; application filed November 3, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE D.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK H. SHEPHERD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Casing of a Soda-Water Apparatus, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, making part of this specification.

In the photograph, A represents the casing of a soda-water apparatus, which is of rectangular form, and is provided at its upper and lower corners with ornamental projections *b c*, between which, and extending out at right angles thereto, are ornamental projections *d*. The top B is inclined on each side from *e* to

the ridge *f*, and in front of this top is an ornamental plate, C, at the base of which is a shelf, D, which is supported on the front upper corner projections *b*, the design thus produced being unique and ornamental.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus, substantially as herein shown and described.
