

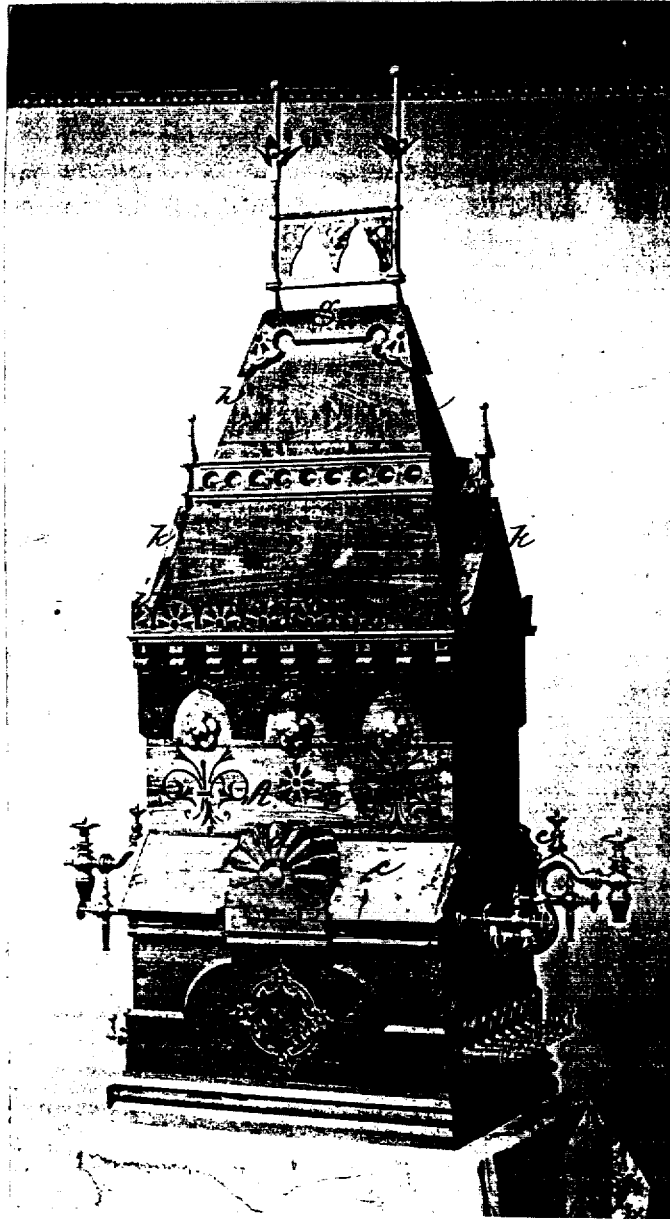

DESIGN FOR THE CASING OF A SODA-WATER APPARATUS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,797**, dated November 16, 1875; application filed November 3, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK H. SHEPHERD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Casing of a Soda-Water Apparatus, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograph making part of this specification.

In the photograph, A represents the body or main portion of the casing of a soda-water apparatus, which is of rectangular form. *b* is the base, above which, on each side, is an incline, *c*, having at its center an ornamental projection, *d*. The portion *e* of the casing above the inclines *c* is of less width than the

base *b*, and this portion is surmounted by a top, B, having a steep incline on each side from *f* to the ridge *g*. The ends *h* of the top B are also inclined from *i* to the ridge *g*, and are each provided with a gable, *k*, a beautiful and unique design being thus produced.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus, substantially as herein shown and described.
