

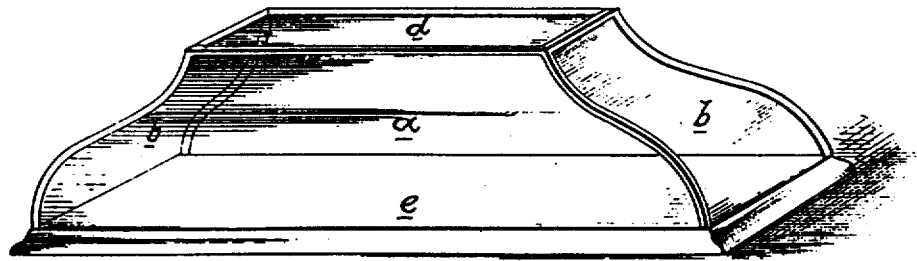

DESIGN FOR A SHOW-CASE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,802**, dated November 23, 1875; application filed November 12, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. GROVE, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Show-Case, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a show-case is fully shown in the accompanying drawing; and consists in imparting a waved appearance to both the front *a* and ends *b b* of the case.

As shown in the drawing, the waved front *a* and ends *b* join the flat top *d* and bottom *e* abruptly; but they may merge into each other either with a gentle or abrupt curve without departing from the main feature of the design.

I claim—

The design for a show-case having a waved front, *a*, and waved ends *b b*, substantially as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
