

DESIGN FOR SLEEVE-BUTTONS AND STUDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. S, S11, dated November 30, 1875; application filed November 6, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS G. BROWN, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Sleeve-Buttons and Studs, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which refer-

ence is made, and in which—
Figures 1, 2, and 4 represent top views of different forms of my improved sleeve-buttons and studs, and Fig. 3 a vertical central section of the same on the line c c of Figs. 1 and 2.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

The object of my design is to furnish sleevebuttons and studs, of plain yet elegant and stylish shape and appearance, by connecting a raised part or table of colored gold with an encircling band or rim of polished gold.

A represents the raised part or table of my improved sleeve buttons or studs, which is

made of any suitable shape, with a flat face, and of sides forming a right angle therewith. The table A projects above an encircling band or rim, B, which corresponds in shape to the table, the table being either oblong, as in Fig. 1, or oblong, with two curved opposite sides, as in Fig. 2, or round, as in Fig. 4, or oval, or of other shape, as I lay no stress on the special shape. This table is made of colored gold, while the lower band or rim is made of polished gold, which sets the table in suitable relief, and which I consider the main point of my design.

I claim as my invention—

The design for sleeve-buttons and studs, consisting of a raised part or table of colored gold, with an encircling band or rim of polished gold, substantially as shown and described.
