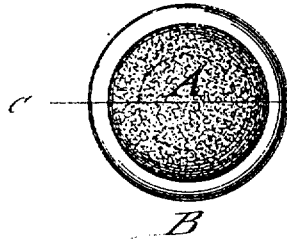

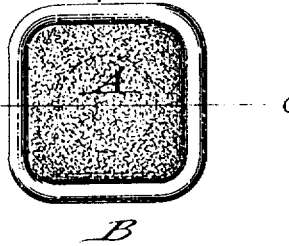
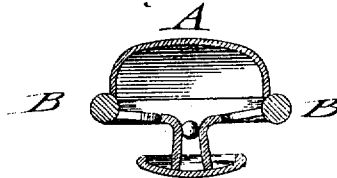

DESIGN FOR SLEEVE-BUTTONS AND STUDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,812**, dated November 30, 1875; application filed November 6, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, THOMAS G. BROWN, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Sleeve-Buttons and Studs, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figures 1 and 2 are top views of my improved sleeve-buttons and studs; and Fig. 3, a vertical transverse section of the same on the line *c c*, Figs. 1 and 2.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

My invention relates to an improved design for sleeve-buttons and studs, by which a neat and plain, yet elegant, appearance of the same is produced. The design consists of a raised and rounded off part or dome of colored gold, with an encircling rim of polished gold.

A represents the central part of my design for sleeve-buttons and studs, and B the encircling rim or band of corresponding shape. The central part A is raised above the rim or band, and made with a flat top or face, that is rounded

off at the sides toward the rim, so as to form a dome, as shown in Fig. 3. The dome is made of colored gold, while the rim is made of polished gold, which forms a kind of frame for the dome part, so as to set the same in suitable relief.

The raised dome may be made of square, oblong, round, or other shape, as desired, the main point being the rounded off or dome shape and the different colors of the gold.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for sleeve-buttons and studs, consisting of a central part or dome, with rounded off edges, raised above the encircling rim or band, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design consisting of the central raised part or dome of sleeve-buttons or studs, made of colored gold, and encircled by a framing, band, or rim of polished gold, substantially as shown and described.
