

## DESIGN FOR TOBACCO-BAGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,816, dated November 30, 1875; application filed November 5, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM J. CUSSEN, of Richmond, in the county of Henrico and in the State of Virginia, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Tobacco-Bags; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated by the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents a bag or package for holding tobacco. This package is made so that when filled it assumes the shape of a pear, in taper-

ing form, as shown, having a string, B, at one end, as the stem of the pear, and the bag tied at the other end.

The pear-shaped package may be made of any size desired.
What I claim is—

The design for a tobacco-package of the pear form, substantially as shown and described.
