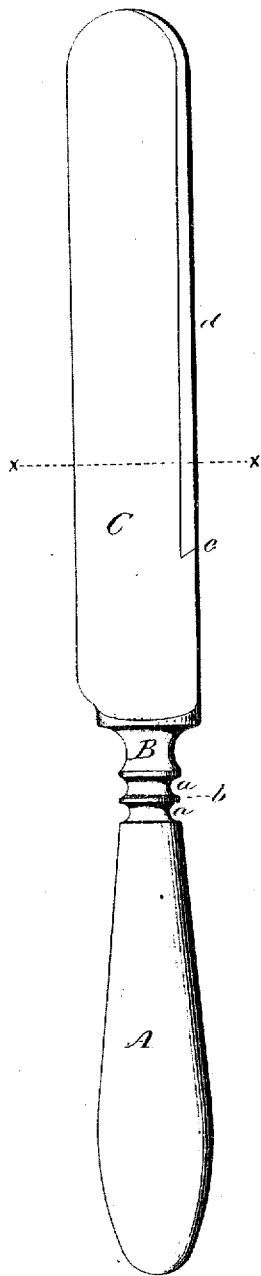

## DESIGN FOR TABLE-CUTLERY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,817**, dated November 30, 1875; application filed November 2, 1875.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES D. FRARY, of New Britain, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Table-Cutlery; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent in—

Figure 1, side view; Fig. 2, transverse section on line *x x*.

This invention relates to a design for table-cutlery; and it consists in forming a double cavetto, with bead between, on the handle, back of the bolster.

The outline of the handle A is immaterial to the design, as also the bolster B. Back of the bolster two cavettos or concave grooves, *a*, are formed around the handle, with a light bead, *b*, between. This constitutes the design, and is applicable to all handled articles of table-service in which a bolster is used, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The design for the handle of table-cutlery, consisting of the double cavetto back of the bolster, as shown and described.
