

DESIGN FOR THE CASING OF A SODA-WATER APPARATUS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,819, dated November 30, 1875; application filed November 18, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

CASE F.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK H. SHEPHERD, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Casing of a Soda-Water Apparatus, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, making part of this specification.

In the photograph, A represents the body or main portion of the casing of a soda-water apparatus, which is of rectangular form, and is surmounted by an ornamental pyramidal top, b, from which rises a rectangular tower, C, so placed as to bring each of its corners or angles in a line half-way between two adjacent corners or angles of the body A. The tower C is provided with an ornamental pyramidal

top or cap, d, from the apex of which rises a finial, e, which may be dispensed with, if desired, a beautiful and unique design being thus produced.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The design for the casing of a soda-water apparatus, consisting of the rectangular portion A, with its pyramidal top b, surmounted by the tower C, substantially as herein shown and described.
