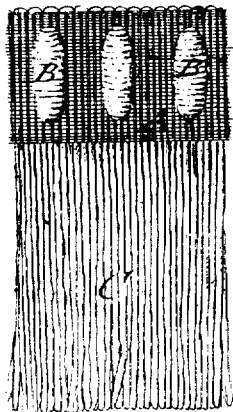
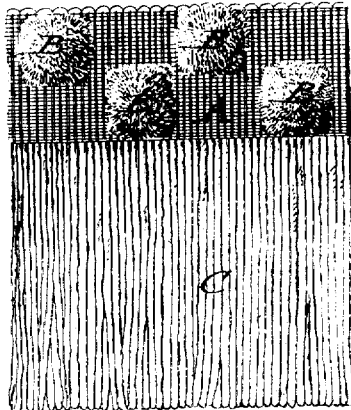

DESIGN FOR TRIMMING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,823**, dated December 7, 1875; application filed November 19, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, **CARL LINDENTHAL**, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Trimmings, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully set forth in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 represents a plan view of my improved trimming with uncut plush heads, and Fig. 2 a plan view of the same, with cut or opened tufts.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

My design relates to an improved trimming for garments, woven directly by suitable machinery; and it consists of a trimming for garments, with a solid or unbroken band or body, having projecting heads or tufts of cut or uncut plush or "moss," and a fringe at the lower edge.

In the drawing, A represents the solid ground, band, or body of my improved trimming for garments, into which are interwoven at suitable intervals, and arranged in any figure or pattern, projecting heads or tufts B of plush or moss. These heads B may be used

either cut or uncut, as desired, the uncut heads being shown in Fig. 1, the cut or opened ones being shown in Fig. 2, forming tufts that impart an appearance of lightness and softness to the continuous band or ground A.

For some purposes the trimming with uncut heads B may be preferred; but for most purposes I consider the trimming with plush or moss tufts, shown in Fig. 2, as the superior, on account of its neater and lighter appearance. The band A is made with a fringe at the lower edge, that forms the finishing border of the trimming.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for trimming for garments, composed of a solid or continuous band or ground, A, with uncut plush heads B, and a fringe, C, substantially as shown and described.
2. The design for trimming for garments, produced of a continuous or solid band or ground with plush or moss tufts and a border-fringe, substantially as shown and described.
