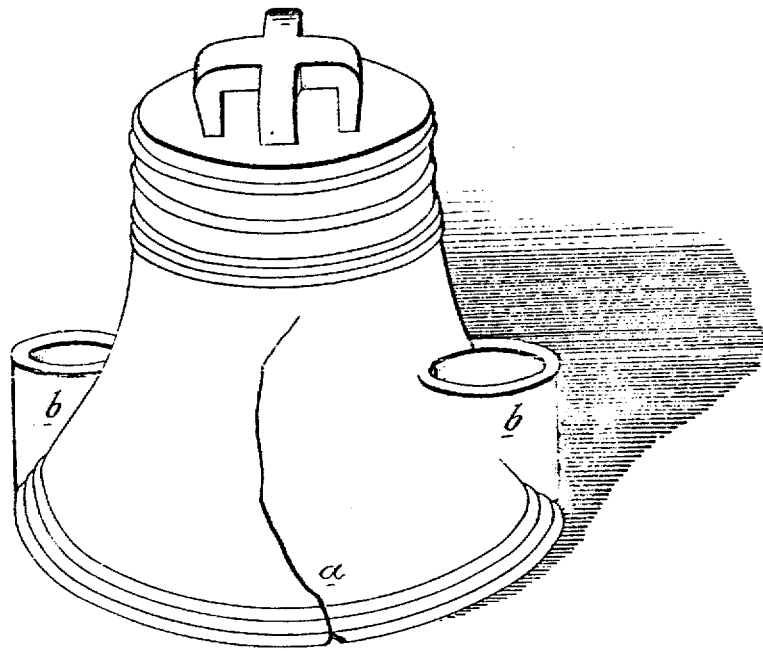

DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,830**, dated December 7, 1875; application filed September 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD FINNEY, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for an Inkstand, of which the following is a specification:

My design for an inkstand is fully shown in the accompanying drawing; and consists of a representation of the Independence Bell, having in its edge a crack, *a*. On either side of the bell are formed projections, *b*, of the character illustrated. The body of the bell may be lettered in the same manner as the Independence Bell itself; but this is not essential, and forms no part of my design.

I claim—

The design for an inkstand, consisting of a representation of the Independence Bell, having on either side projections *b b*, all substantially as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
