

## DESIGN FOR A TOY CHARIOT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,832, dated December 7, 1875; application filed November 4, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD R. IVES, of Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and in the State of Connecticut, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Hippodrome-Chariot; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

My design is the representation of a toy hippodrome-chariot drawn by two horses, driven by a lady standing in the chariot.

A represents the chariot; B B, the wheels; and C C, the horses. On the sides of the

chariot A are the representations of mounted Roman knights, with shield and spear. This, however, is a mere ornament, and not essential in the design. D is the representation of a lady driver standing in the chariot, and driving the horses attached thereto.

What I claim is-

The design for a toy consisting essentially of the chariot-body, the wheels, the driver, and horses, grouped together as shown and described.
