## DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,833, dated December 7, 1875; application filed November 22, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HUGH S. KERR, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Inkstands, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

My design is an inkstand in the form of a

bell, A, supported on a base of the outline of a scroll, B, and book C, the bell suggesting the "Centennial," the scroll the Declaration of Independence, and the book the Constitution of the United States.

What I claim as my invention is— The design for inkstand, consisting of the bell, scroll, and book, as shown.
