DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,849**, dated December 14, 1875; application filed December 7, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, BERNARD SIMON, of Scranton, in the county of Luzerne and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and Improved Design for Bottles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A is the body of the bottle, in the form of a bust of a soldier of the Continental army. B is the pedestal or base, and N is the neck, of the bottle. The front of the bottle may be flattened at C to form a tablet, upon which a label may be pasted, indicating the contents

of the bottle, and the words "Simon's Centennial Bitters" may be molded in the bottle around the lower edge of the bust, at D.

I do not, however, regard the tablet C as an essential feature of my design, as the label may be pasted on the rounded surface of the bottle, if preferred. The words "Simon's Centennial Bitters" may also be omitted.

I claim as my invention—

The design for bottles herein described, consisting of the bust of a soldier of the Continental army, having the base B and neck N, as shown in the accompanying photograph.
