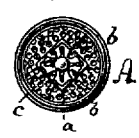

DESIGN FOR HEAD OF STAIR-CARPET FASTENERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,854, dated December 21, 1875; application filed November 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

CASE A.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MORITZ KRICKL, of New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for the Head of a Stair-Carpet Fastener, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a face view, and Fig. 2 a central longitudinal section, of the new carpet-fastener head.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in all the figures.

This invention relates to a new configuration of the head of a sectional stair-carpet fastener; and consists in forming on the center of the face of the head A a prismatic projection, *a*, and in making the rim or border of the face of said head of a projecting annular ledge *b*, so that that part *c* of the face of the head which is between the said ledge *b* and the said prism *a* is depressed, as shown in Fig. 2.

By this configuration a brilliant effect of light and shade is produced, while it serves at the same time the useful purpose of adapting the head to the reception of a screw wrench or key for unscrewing it from the shank or pin of the fastener.

It will be seen that the depression *c* is continuous, extending entirely around the prism *a*, by which arrangement an annular space, polygonal at the inner circumference, is produced.

I claim as my invention—

The design for the head A of a carpet-fastener, the same consisting of the projecting central prism *a*, continuous annular depression *c*, and ledge *b*, substantially as shown and described.
