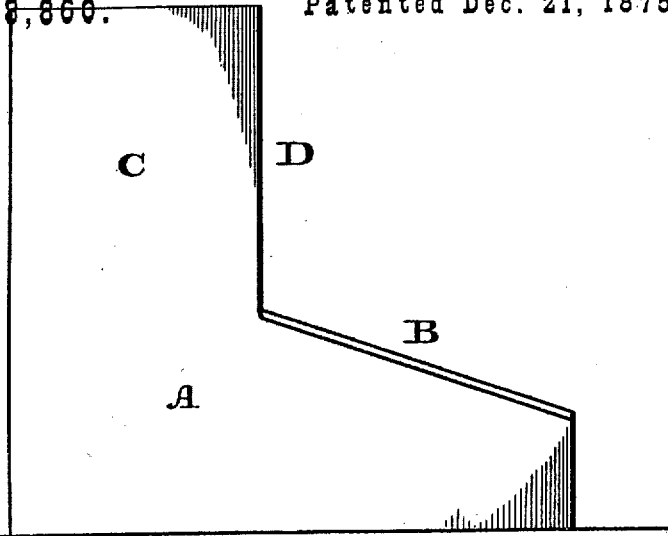

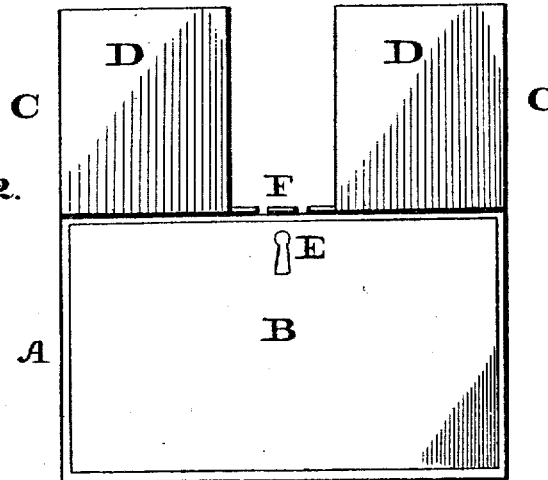
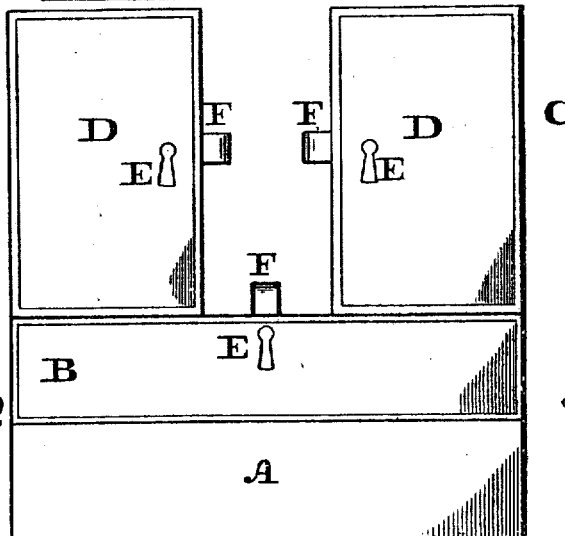

DESIGN FOR COLLAR AND CUFF BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,860**, dated December 21, 1875; application filed November 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LOUIS TIM, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Collar and Cuff Box, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the horizontal portion of the body of the box, which has a lid, B, resting at an inclination on the top of the body. From the upper portion, at what may be

termed the rear of the box, there rises the vertical portion of the box, the same consisting of two upright bodies, C C, which are provided with doors D D. Key-hole imitations E E are formed on the lids and doors B D, and loops F are attached thereto.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for box, consisting of the horizontal portion A, with lid B, and the upright portions C C, with doors D, as shown and described.
