

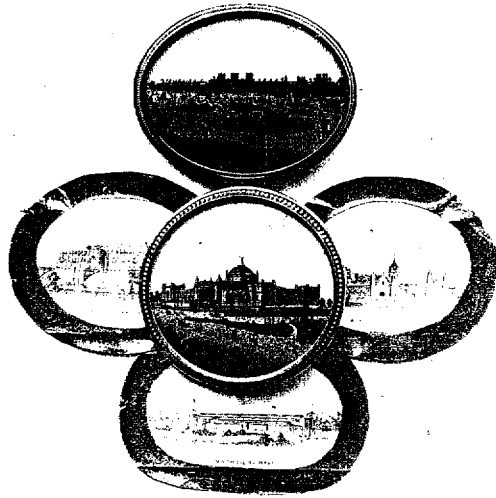

DESIGN FOR BRESTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,878**, dated December 28, 1875; application filed November 27, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SIMON PFAELZER, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Design for Breastpins and other Jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

a represents the central face of the breastpin, and *b c d e* the surrounding faces. The face *a* represents a view of what is known as the Memorial Hall; *b*, of the Main Building; *e*, of the Horticultural Hall; *d*, of the Agri-

cultural Hall; *e*, of the Machinery Hall, the different views being those of the several buildings erected at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in commemoration of the one-hundredth anniversary of American independence, of for what is known as the Centennial Exhibition, thus forming an attractive design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a breastpin and other articles of jewelry, composed of the faces *a b c d e*, having represented thereon views of the Centennial buildings, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
