DESIGN FOR GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8.879, dated December 28, 1875; application filed December 11, 1875. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations.

The name of the design is "Checkers up at the farm." It represents a city gentleman playing checkers with a farmer. The board is placed between them on top of a barrel, and the farmer is seated on a basket and the gentleman on a stool. The farmer has beaten

his opponent and is laughing at him. A lady with a child in her arms is standing behind the barrel. She is watching the game, while the child is kicking off the checkers.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a group of statuary, representing two men playing checkers, and a woman and child looking on, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
