

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-LIGHTERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,880, dated December 28, 1875; application filed December 21, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK R. SEIDEN-STICKER, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Cigar-Light; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for what are commonly termed "eigar-lights"—that is to say, a lamp or burner from which cigars may be lighted; and it consists in a body representing the "Liberty Bell," with a vertical

cannon at each side, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

On a suitable base a body, or may be a fount, is placed, representing the "Old Liberty Bell." This is surmounted by the burner, and at each side is the representation of a vertical cannon, which serves the purpose of alcoholfounts for the lights.

I claim-

The design for eigar-light, consisting of the "Liberty-Bell" body and cannon at each side, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
