DESIGN FOR A BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,885, dated January 4, 1876; application filed December 16, 1875. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. HALSEY, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have originated a Design for Breastpin, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying illustration or drawing making part of this specification.

The drawing represents a face view of my

breastpin.

My design consists in a breastpin the baseplate of which represents a portion of a branch of a tree, the face of which is ornamented by two roses, with leaves projecting from each side, and by forget-me-nots and lilies, with appropriate leaves, toward the ends of the supporting-plate.

In the drawing, the letter A designates the supporting-plate of my breastpin, said supporting-plate being the representation of a branch of a tree with broken side branches a a. The face of this supporting-plate is ornamented by

two roses, bb, with leaves cc, and by forget-menots d d, lilies e e, and leaves ff, as shown.

By these means a design for a breastpin of a novel and ornamental character is produced.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

1. The design of a breastpin the supportingplate of which represents a portion of a branch of a tree with broken side branches a a, as shown and described.

2. The design for a breastpin composed of a supporting-plate representing a portion of a branch of a tree, and ornamented by roses b b, leaves c c, forget-me-nots d d, lilies e e, and leaves ff, as shown and described.
