DESIGN FOR STAND-LAMPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,890, dated January 11, 1876; application filed December 9, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NATHANIEL L. BRAD-LEY, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Stand-Lamps; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for what are known as "stand-lamps"—that is, a lamp in which the fount is supported upon a pedestal; and it consists in a miniature "Liberty Bell" placed on the base, and upon the top of which the lamp-fount is set, as shown in

the accompanying illustration. The base may be of any desirable shape, here represented as octagonal. Resting on this is the miniature bell, and upon the top of the bell the fount. The form of the fount is no part of this design, it only being essential that there be a fount of some character to complete the design.

I claim-

The herein-described design for lamps, consisting of the miniature Liberty Bell as the pedestal, combined with a lamp-fount above the said bell, substantially as shown.
