## DESIGN FOR THE LOWER-CASE LETTERS OF A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,891, dated January 11, 1876; application filed November 18, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES M. CONNER, of Greenville, Hudson county, New Jersey, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Lower-Case Letters of a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made.

The design is for a letter or type part Roman and part antique, the terminations being round-cornered or arched.

The design differs from the "Celtic" shown

on page 69 of Bruce's abridged specimenbook, in that it is more condensed, and terminations, as already stated, are round-cornered or arched, whereas in the Celtic the terminations run at a right angle to the heavy part of the letter.

What I claim as new is—
The design for the lower-case letters of a font of printing-types, as shown.
