Be it known that I, JAMES M. CONNER, of Greenville, Hudson county, New Jersey, have invented and produced a new and original Design for the Lower-Case Letters of a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of a

letter partly Roman and partly antique, made very open and round-cornered or arched at the ceriph or hair line.
