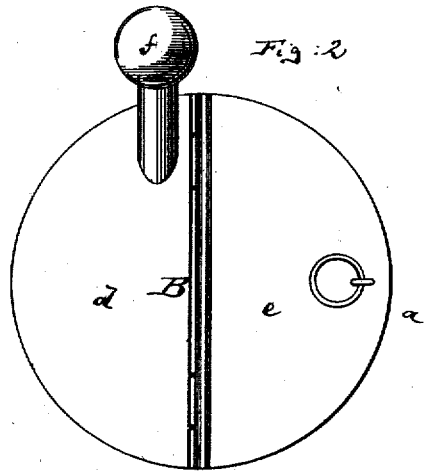
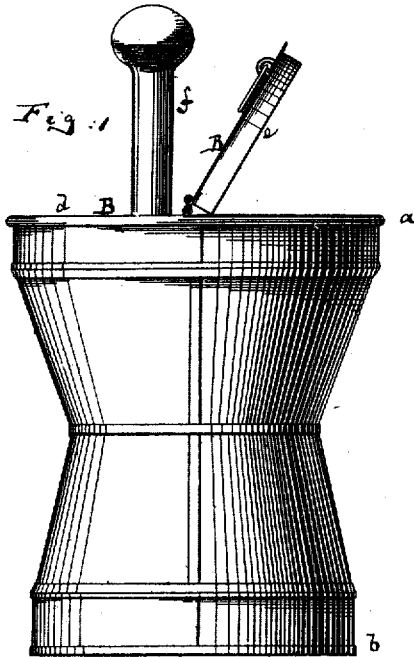

DESIGN FOR A CANISTER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,898**, dated January 11, 1876; application filed November 24, 1875.

[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL ROSENBLATT, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Canister, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 is a side view, and Fig. 2 a top view, of my new design for a canister.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in both figures.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the figures, *a* and *b* being annuli at the top and bottom of the canister; *B*, the halves of the top; *C*, the center of the canister, and *d* the half of the top, having the projection *f*;

and *e* being the lid, which is of circular form, but divided by a straight line into two semicircular, or nearly semicircular, parts, *d* and *e*, as clearly shown in Fig. 2. An inclined pestle, *f*, projects from the part *d* on one side of the aforementioned straight dividing-line.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a canister contracted from both ends toward the center, having the annuli *a* and *b* at the ends, and the attachment *f*, all substantially as shown.
