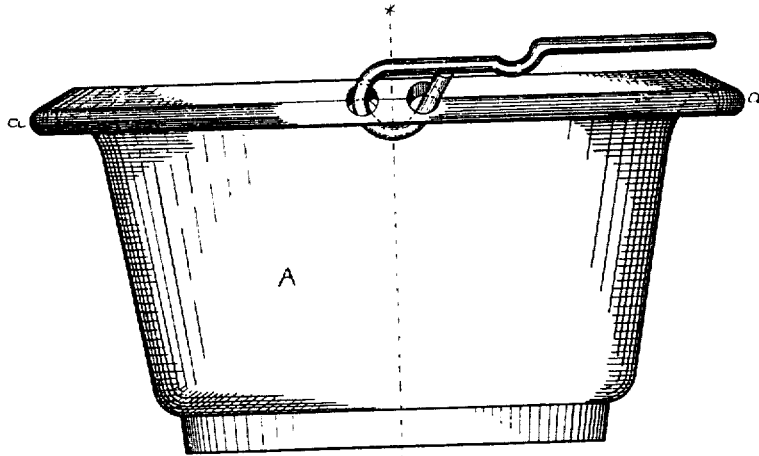

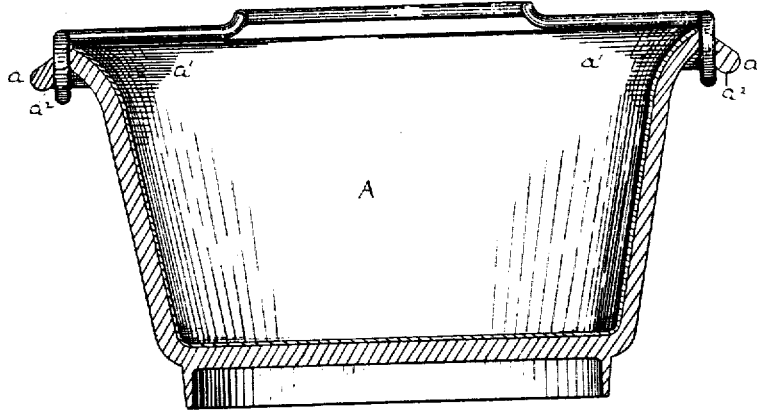

DESIGN FOR KETTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,908**, dated January 18, 1876; application filed November 22, 1875.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES WILEY, of Allegheny, county of Allegheny, State of Pennsylvania, have invented or discovered a new and useful Improved Design for Kettles; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, concise, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which—like letters indicating like parts—

Figure 1 is a side elevation of a kettle illustrating my improved design, and Fig. 2 is a vertical sectional view thereof.

In so far as the features herein shown or described are merely useful, they constitute the subject-matter of the proper application for a patent, and the present application has particular reference to matters of shape and form, such as add materially to the appearance of the kettle manufactured.

The kettle A has a taper form, with preferably a slight curve from its lower end to within from one to two inches of its mouth, more or less, and through the remainder of its

height it flares outwardly in trumpet shape, as at a^1 . Its mouth is surrounded by a rim, a , which slopes downwardly from a horizontal plane on both its upper and lower faces.

The amount of taper and flare in the body of the kettle, as also the slope of the rim, may be varied at pleasure; but I consider that the best proportions, in these respects, for ornamental effect, are such as substantially are shown, the rib a^2 on the lower face of the rim being made or not, at pleasure.

I claim herein as my design—

1. The design for kettle of a flaring, trumpet-shaped body, mouth, and rim, substantially as shown and described.
2. The rim a , sloping downwardly below a horizontal plane, substantially as set forth and described.
