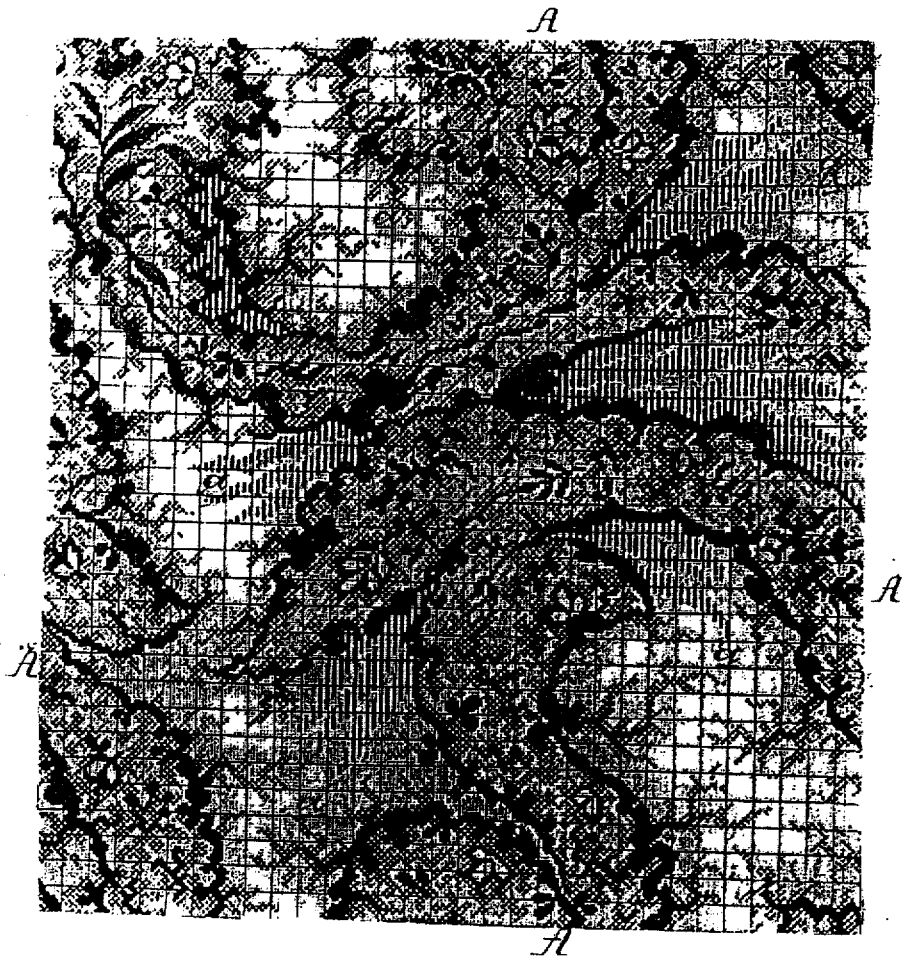

DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **S,917**, dated January 18, 1876; application filed January 7, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration; and consists of a series of scroll-like bands, A, provided with elaborate foliated ornamentation, and interlocked so as to form an endless scroll-like figure, too fully shown in the drawing to need description.

The plain groundwork of the pattern is relieved by small stems and sprays *a*.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a carpet-pattern, as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
