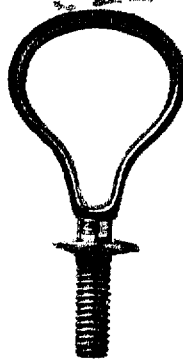

DESIGN FOR HARNESS-TRIMMINGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,921**, dated January 18, 1876; application filed January 7, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SIMON WIENER, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented and designed a Pattern for Harness-Trimnings, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the representative sample shown in the photographic illustration of the terret, which is a representative harness-trimming, and consists in the trimmings made in the shape of a

bell or bell pear, with the shank attached to either end, as taste or convenience may dictate. Some of the trimmings, while they strictly conform to the same bell-shape, may slightly vary according to the place they occupy.

I claim—

The design for harness-trimmings, represented by the pear-shaped terret, as shown and described.
