

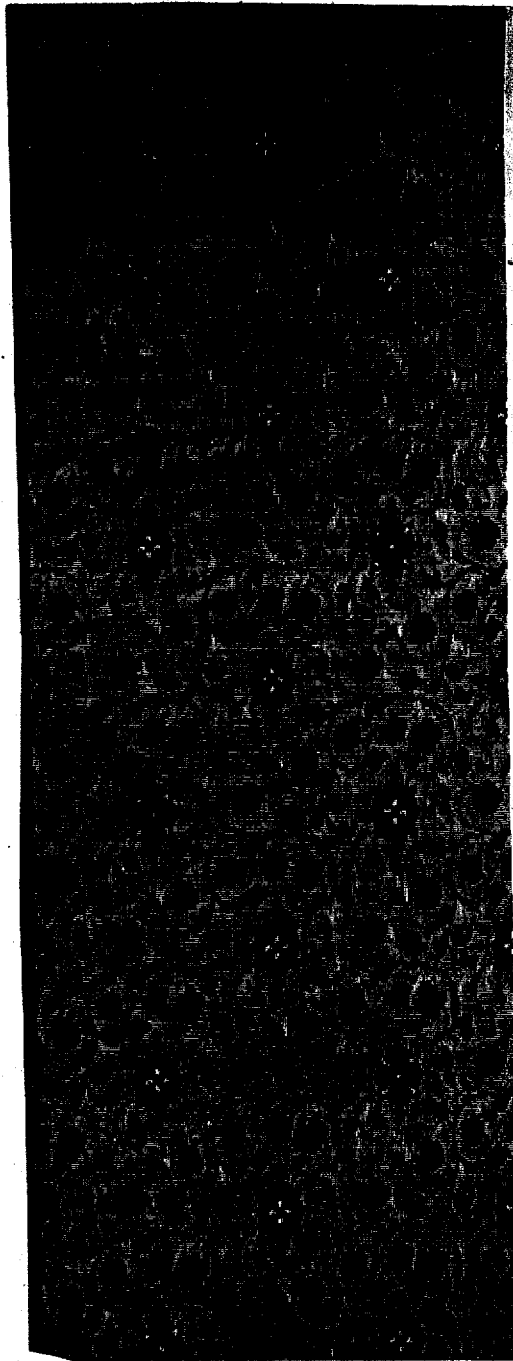

DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,935**, dated January 25, 1876; application filed January 17, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS J. STEARNS, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and original Design for Carpets, of which the following is a specification:

This design is intended particularly for hall and stair carpets, and when used for stairs a border of any desired configuration may be added without departing from the spirit of my invention.
