

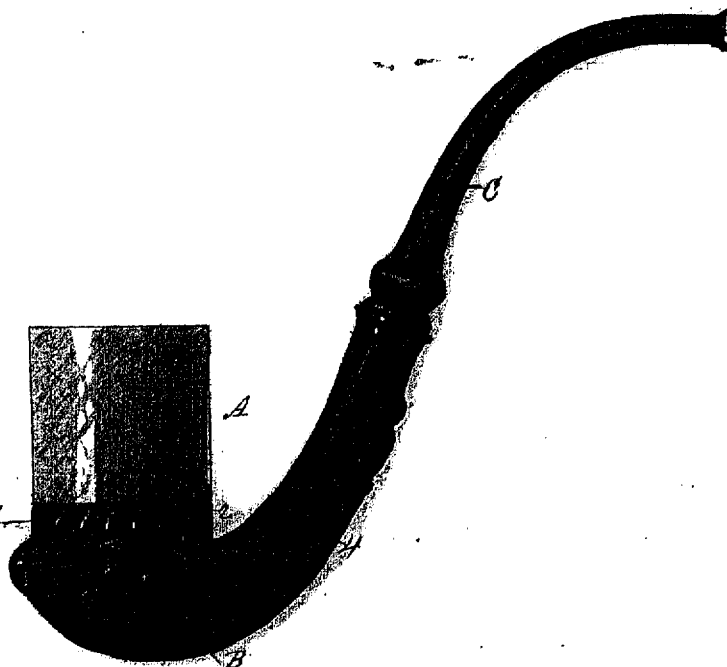

LEONHARD NAX, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR TOBACCO-PIPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,939**, dated February 1, 1876; application filed January 18, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONHARD NAX, of the city of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Pattern for a Tobacco-Pipe, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photolithographic illustration or drawing making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photolithographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the tobacco-holder, B the body, and C the mouth or stem. The tobacco-holder A is in the form of a vertical cylinder resting upon a corresponding cylindrical portion, *b'*, of the body B. The body B is ornamented with the bas-relief pendants 2 around the

cylindrical portion *b'*, and the bas-relief scroll-leaves 3 and 4 around both sides of the said body. I prefer to make the tobacco-holder A of wood, and the body B and stem C of dark or black-colored gutta-percha or hard rubber; but I do not consider the materials and color of said parts to be essential elements in my design, and I do not claim them.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a tobacco-pipe, in which the tobacco-holder A is cylindrical, and the body B ornamented with the bas-relief points 2 and scroll-leaves 3 and 4, substantially as described and shown.
