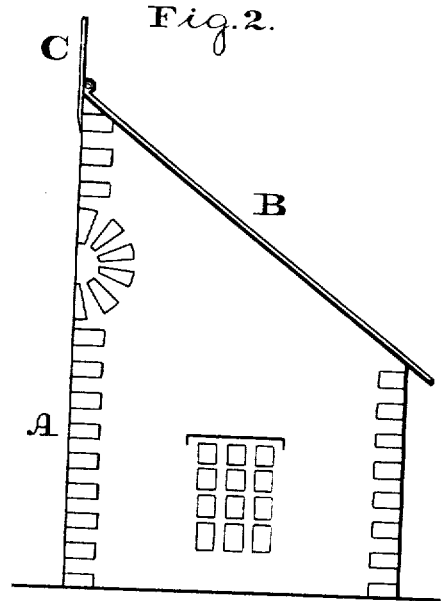
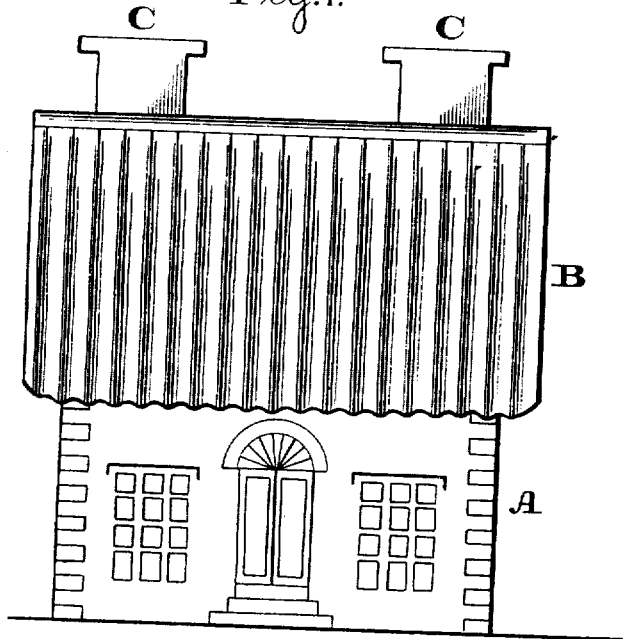

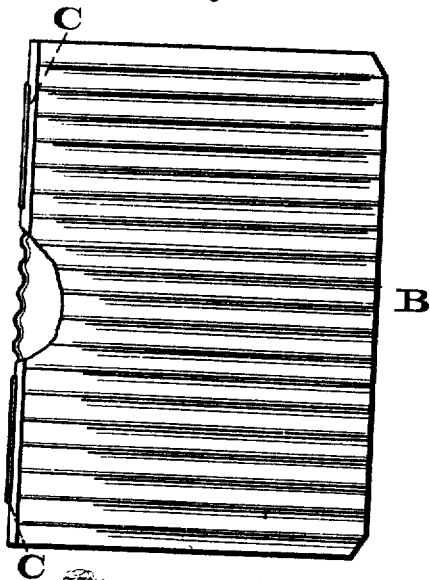
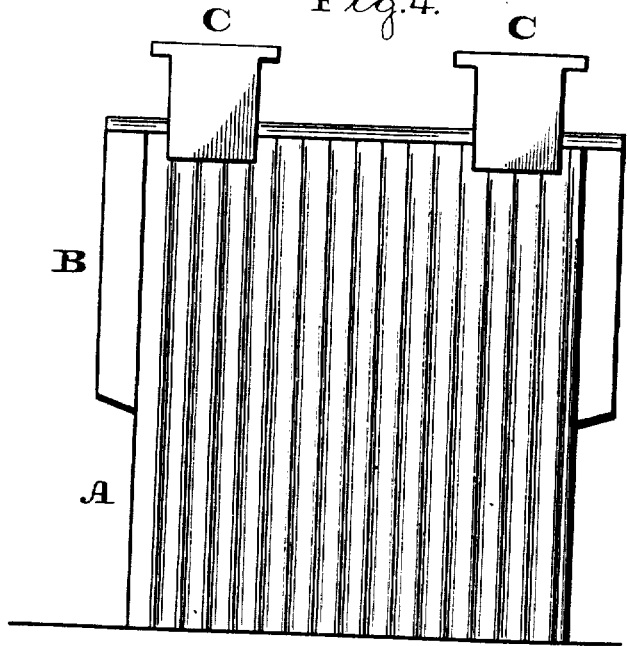

DESIGN FOR MATCH-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,952**, dated February 8, 1876; application filed January 22, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES N. CADWALLADER, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for a Match-Box, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 is a front view. Fig. 2 is a side view. Fig. 3 is a top view. Fig. 4 is a rear view.

A represents the body of the box, and B the lid or cover, which is hinged to the body, and extends in a diagonal direction. Pieces C C rise from the upper portion of the box, and are of the form of chimneys.

The general appearance of the box is that of a house with a slant roof, the body A having marked thereon the outlines of doors and windows, and the lid B forming the roof.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for match-box, the same consisting of the body A and diagonally-extending lid B, the whole presenting the appearance of a house with a slant roof, as shown and described.
