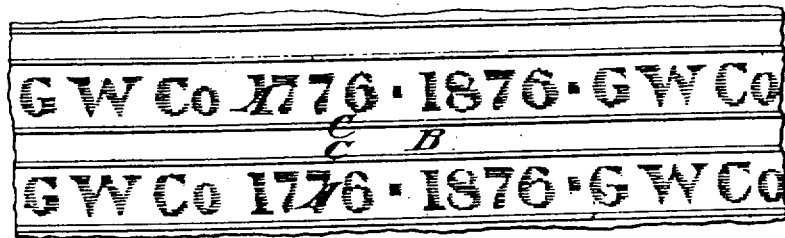
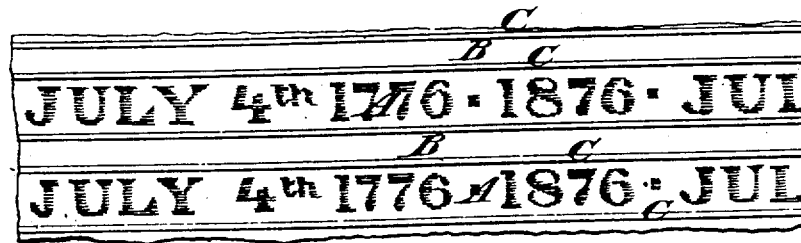

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, WALTER D. MIDDLETON and JOSEPH HEEP, of Utica, New York, have invented a new and original Design for Cassimeres, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

The design consists of stripes of letters and figures, A, woven in the goods, with other plain or fancy stripes, B, and ribs C. The

letters and figures may be the same color as the rest of the cloth, or any different color.

We claim as our invention—

The combination of letter or figure stripes A, plain stripes B, and ribs C, all arranged to exhibit the design shown and described.
